

HOW TO USE THIS MEDICINE: HOW IS THIS DRUG BEST TAKEN? Use this drug as ordered by your doctor. Read all information given to you. Follow all instructions closely. Take with or without food. Take last dose of the day at least 4 hours before bedtime. HOW DO I STORE AND/OR THROW OUT THIS DRUG? Store at room temperature protected from light. Store in a dry place. Do not store in a bathroom. Keep all drugs in a safe place. Keep all drugs out of the reach of ch ildren and pets. Throw away unused or expired drugs. Call your doctor right away if you have hallucinations; change in the way you act; or signs of mood changes like depression, thoughts of suicide, nervousness, emotional ups and downs, thinking that is not normal, anxiety, or lack of interest in life. A severe and sometimes deadly problem called sectornin syndrome may happen if you take this drug with certain other drugs. DEXTROAMPHETAMINE SACCHARATE, AMPHETAMINE ASPARTATE, DEXTROAMPHETAMINE SULFATE AND AMPHETAMINE SULFATE

(DEX-troe-am-FET-uh-meen SACK-uh-rate, am-FET-uh-meen ass-PAR-tate, DEX-troe-am-FET-uh-meen SULL-fate, and am-FET-uh-meen SULL-fate)

TABLETS (MIXED SALTS OF A SINGLE ENTITY AMPHETAMINE PRODUCT) CII

Read the Medication Guide that comes with dextroamphetamine saccharate, amphetamine aspartate, dextroamphetamine sulfate and amphetamine sulfate tablets (mixed amphetamine salts) before you or your child starts taking it and each time you get a refill. There may be new information. This Medication Guide does not take the place of talking to your doctor about you or your child's treatment with mixed amphetamine salts.

What is the most important information I should know about mixed amphetamine salts?

The following have been reported with use of mixed amphetamine salts and other stimulant medicines.

- 1. Heart-related problems:
- sudden death in patients who have heart problems or heart defects
- stroke and heart attack in adults
- increased blood pressure and heart rate

Tell your doctor if you or your child have any heart problems, heart defects, high blood pressure, or a family history of these problems.

Your doctor should check you or your child carefully for heart problems before starting mixed amphetamine salts.

Your doctor should check your or your child's blood pressure and heart rate regularly during treatment with mixed amphetamine salts.

Call your doctor right away if you or your child have any signs of heart problems such as chest pain, shortness of breath, or fainting while taking mixed amphetamine salts.

2. Mental (Psychiatric) problems:

All Patients

- new or worse behavior and thought problems
- · new or worse bipolar illness

· new or worse aggressive behavior or hostility

Children and Teenagers

 new psychotic symptoms (such as hearing voices, believing things that are not true, are suspicious) or new manic symptoms

Tell your doctor about any mental problems you or your child have, or about a family history of suicide, bipolar illness, or depression.

Call your doctor right away if you or your child have any new or worsening mental symptoms or problems while taking mixed amphetamine salts, especially seeing or hearing things that are not real, believing things that are not real, or are suspicious.

<u>3. Circulation problems in fingers and toes [Peripheral</u> Vasculopathy, Including Raynaud's Phenomenon]:

- · Fingers or toes may feel numb, cool, painful
- Fingers or toes may change color from pale, to blue, to red

Tell your doctor if you have or your child has numbness, pain, skin color change, or sensitivity to temperature in your fingers or toes.

Call your doctor right away if you have or your child has any signs of unexplained wounds appearing on fingers or toes while taking mixed amphetamine salts.

What are mixed amphetamine salts?

Mixed amphetamine salts are a central nervous system stimulant prescription medicine. It is used for the treatment of Attention-Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). Mixed amphetamine salts may help increase attention and decrease impulsiveness and hyperactivity in patients with ADHD.

Mixed amphetamine salts should be used as a part of a total treatment program for ADHD that may include counseling or other therapies.

Mixed amphetamine salts are also used in the treatment of a sleep disorder called narcolepsy.

Mixed amphetamine salts are a federally controlled substance (CII) because it can be abused or lead to dependence. Keep mixed amphetamine salts in a safe place to prevent misuse and abuse. Selling or giving away mixed amphetamine salts may harm others, and is against the law.

Tell your doctor if you or your child have (or have a family history of) ever abused or been dependent on alcohol, prescription medicines or street drugs.

Who should not take mixed amphetamine salts? Mixed amphetamine salts should not be taken if you or your child:

- have heart disease or hardening of the arteries
- have moderate to severe high blood pressure
- have hyperthyroidism
- have an eye problem called glaucoma
- are very anxious, tense, or agitated
- have a history of drug abuse
- are taking or have taken within the past 14 days an antidepression medicine called a monoamine oxidase inhibitor or MAOI.
- are sensitive to, allergic to, or had a reaction to other stimulant medicines

Mixed amphetamine salts are not recommended for use in children less than 3 years old.

Mixed amphetamine salts may not be right for you or your child. Before starting mixed amphetamine salts tell your or your child's doctor about all health conditions (or a family history of) including:

- · heart problems, heart defects, high blood pressure
- mental problems including psychosis, mania, bipolar illness, or depression
- tics or Tourette's syndrome

- · liver or kidney problems
- circulation problems in fingers and toes
- · thyroid problems
- seizures or have had an abnormal brain wave test (EEG)

Tell your doctor if you or your child are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or breastfeeding.

Can mixed amphetamine salts be taken with other medicines? Tell your doctor about all of the medicines that you or your child take including prescription and nonprescription medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Mixed amphetamine salts and some medicines may interact with each other and cause serious side effects. Sometimes the doses of other medicines will need to be adjusted while taking mixed amphetamine salts.

Your doctor will decide whether mixed amphetamine salts can be taken with other medicines.

Especially tell your doctor if you or your child take:

- anti-depression medicines including MAOIs
- blood pressure medicines
- seizure medicines
- blood thinner medicines
- · cold or allergy medicines that contain decongestants
- stomach acid medicines

Know the medicines that you or your child take. Keep a list of your medicines with you to show your doctor and pharmacist.

Do not start any new medicine while taking mixed amphetamine salts without talking to your doctor first.

How should mixed amphetamine salts be taken?

- Take mixed amphetamine salts exactly as prescribed. Your doctor may adjust the dose until it is right for you or your child.
- Mixed amphetamine salt tablets are usually taken two to three times a day. The first dose is usually taken when you first wake in the morning. One or two more doses may be taken during the day, 4 to 6 hours apart.
- · Mixed amphetamine salts can be taken with or without food.
- From time to time, your doctor may stop mixed amphetamine salts treatment for a while to check ADHD symptoms.
- Your doctor may do regular checks of the blood, heart, and blood pressure while taking mixed amphetamine salts. Children should have their height and weight checked often while taking mixed amphetamine salts. Mixed amphetamine salts treatment may be stopped if a problem is found during these check-ups.
- If you or your child take too much mixed amphetamine salts or overdose, call your doctor or poison control center right away, or get emergency treatment.

What are possible side effects of mixed amphetamine salts? See "What is the most important information I should know about mixed amphetamine salts?" for information on reported heart and mental problems.

Other serious side effects include:

- · slowing of growth (height and weight) in children
- · seizures, mainly in patients with a history of seizures
- · eyesight changes or blurred vision
- serotonin syndrome. A potentially life-threatening problem called serotonin syndrome can happen when medicines such

as mixed amphetamine salts are taken with certain other medicines. Symptoms of serotonin syndrome may include:

- agitation, hallucinations, coma or other changes in mental status
- problems controlling your movements or muscle twitching
- fast heartbeat
- 。 high or low blood pressure
- sweating or fever
- nausea or vomiting
- 。 diarrhea
- muscle stiffness or tightness
- Common side effects include:
- stomach ache
- decreased appetite
- nervousness

Mixed amphetamine salts may affect your or your child's ability to drive or do other dangerous activities.

Talk to your doctor if you or your child have side effects that are bothersome or do not go away.

This is not a complete list of possible side effects. Ask your doctor or pharmacist for more information.

Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088.

How should I store mixed amphetamine salts?

- Store mixed amphetamine salts in a safe place at room temperature, 20° to 25°C (68° to 77°F).
- Keep mixed amphetamine salts and all medicines out of the reach of children.

General information about mixed amphetamine salts

Medicines are sometimes prescribed for purposes other than those listed in a Medication Guide. Do not use mixed amphetamine salts for a condition for which it was not prescribed. Do not give mixed amphetamine salts to other people, even if they have the same condition. It may harm them and it is against the law. This Medication Guide summarizes the most important information about mixed amphetamine salts. If you would like more information, talk with your doctor. You can ask your doctor or pharmacist for information about mixed amphetamine salts that was written for healthcare professionals.

What are the ingredients in mixed amphetamine salts?

Active Ingredient: dextroamphetamine saccharate, amphetamine aspartate, dextroamphetamine sulfate and amphetamine sulfate. Inactive Ingredients: If you need more information about the inactive ingredients in this medicine ask your pharmacist for a complete list.

YOUR RIGHTS

When it comes to your health information, you have certain rights. This section explains your rights and some of our responsibilities to help you. Get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record

- · You can ask to see or get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record and other health information we have about you. Ask us how.
- We will provide a copy or a summary of your health information, usually within 30 days of your request. We may charge a reasonable, cost-based fee.

Ask us to correct your medical record

- · You can ask us to correct health information about you that you think is incorrect or incomplete. Ask us how to do this.
- · We may say "no" to your request, but we'll tell you why in writing within 60 days.

Request confidential communications

- · You can ask us to contact you in a specific way (for example, home or office phone) or to send mail to a different address.
- We will say "yes" to all reasonable requests.

Ask us to limit what we use or share

- You can ask us not to use or share certain health information for treatment, payment, or our operations. We are not required to agree to your request, and we may say "no" if it would affect your care

Get a list of those with whom we've shared information

What is the most important information I should know about Adderall[®]?

The following have been reported with use of Adderall[®] and other stimulant medicines.

1. Heart-Related problems:

- · sudden death in patients who have heart problems or heart defects
- stroke and heart attack in adults
- · increased blood pressure and heart rate

Tell your doctor if you or your child have any heart problems, heart defects, high blood pressure, or a family history of these problems.

Your doctor should check you or your child carefully for heart problems before starting Adderall[®].

Tell your doctor if you or your child have (or have a family history of) ever abused or been dependent on alcohol, prescription medicines or street drugs.

Who should not take Adderall[®]? Adderall[®] should not be taken if you or your child:

- · have heart disease or hardening of the arteries
- have moderate to severe high blood pressure
- have hyperthyroidism
- have an eye problem called glaucoma
- are very anxious, tense, or agitated
- have a history of drug abuse
- are taking or have taken within the past 14 days an anti-depression medicine called a monoamine
 - oxidase inhibitor or MAOI.
- are sensitive to, allergic to, or had a reaction to other stimulant medicines Adderall[®] is not recommended for use in children less than 3 years old.

Adderall[®] is a federally controlled substance (CII) because it can be abused or lead to dependence. Keep Adderall[®] in a safe place to prevent misuse and abuse. Selling or giving away Adderall[®] may harm others, and is against the law.

Tell your doctor if you or your child have (or have a family history of) ever abused or been dependent on alcohol, prescription medicines or street drugs.

Who should not take Adderall®?

Adderall[®] should not be taken if you or your child:

- · have heart disease or hardening of the arteries
- have moderate to severe high blood pressure
- have hyperthyroidism
- have an eye problem called glaucoma
- are very anxious, tense, or agitated
- · have a history of drug abuse
- are taking or have taken within the past 14 days an antidepression medicine called a monoamine oxidase inhibitor or MAOI.
- are sensitive to, allergic to, or had a reaction to other stimulant medicines

Adderall[®] is not recommended for use in children less than 3 years old.

Adderall[®] may not be right for you or your child. Before starting Adderall[®] tell your or your child's doctor about all health conditions (or a family history of) including:

- · heart problems, heart defects, high blood pressure
- mental problems including psychosis, mania, bipolar illness, or depression
- · tics or Tourette's syndrome
- · liver or kidney problems
- · thyroid problems
- seizures or have had an abnormal brain wave test (EEG)
- · circulation problems in fingers and toes

Tell your doctor if you or your child are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or breastfeeding.

Can Adderall® be taken with other medicines?

Tell your doctor about all of the medicines that you or your child take including prescription and nonprescription medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Adderall[®] and some medicines may interact with each other and cause serious side effects. Sometimes the doses of other medicines will need to be adjusted while taking Adderall[®].

Your doctor will decide whether Adderall[®] can be taken with other medicines.

Especially tell your doctor if you or your child take:

- anti-depression medicines including MAOIs
- blood pressure medicines
- · seizure medicines
- blood thinner medicines
- · cold or allergy medicines that contain decongestants
- · stomach acid medicines

Know the medicines that you or your child take. Keep a list of your medicines with you to show your doctor and pharmacist.

Do not start any new medicine while taking Adderall[®] without talking to your doctor first.

How should Adderall® be taken?

- Take Adderall[®] exactly as prescribed. Your doctor may adjust the dose until it is right for you or your child.
- Adderall[®] tablets are usually taken two to three times a day. The first dose is usually taken when you first wake in the morning. One or two more doses may be taken during the day, 4 to 6 hours apart.
- Adderall[®] can be taken with or without food.
- From time to time, your doctor may stop Adderall[®] treatment for a while to check ADHD symptoms.
- Your doctor may do regular checks of the blood, heart, and blood pressure while taking Adderall[®]. Children should have their height and weight checked often while taking Adderall[®]. Adderall[®] treatment may be stopped if a problem is found during these check-ups.
- If you or your child take too much Adderall[®] or overdoses, call your doctor or poison control center right away, or get emergency treatment.

What are possible side effects of Adderall®?

See "What is the most important information I should know about Adderall®?" for information on reported heart and mental problems.

Other serious side effects include:

- · slowing of growth (height and weight) in children
- · seizures, mainly in patients with a history of seizures
- · eyesight changes or blurred vision
- Serotonin syndrome. A potentially life-threatening problem called serotonin syndrome can happen when medicines such as Adderall[®] are taken with certain other medicines. Symptoms of serotonin syndrome may include:
 - agitation, hallucinations, coma or other changes in mental status
 - 。 problems controlling your movements or muscle twitching
 - o fast heartbeat
 - high or low blood pressure
 - 。 sweating or fever
 - nausea or vomiting
 - 。 diarrhea
 - muscle stiffness or tightness

Common side effects include:

- stomach ache
- decreased appetite
- nervousness

Adderall[®] may affect your or your child's ability to drive or do other dangerous activities. Talk to your doctor if you or your child have side effects that are bothersome or do not go away.

This is not a complete list of possible side effects. Ask your doctor or pharmacist for more information.

Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088.

How should I store Adderall®?

- Store Adderall[®] in a safe place at room temperature, 20° to 25°C (68° to 77°F).
- Keep Adderall[®] and all medicines out of the reach of children.

General information about Adderall®

Medicines are sometimes prescribed for purposes other than those listed in a Medication Guide. Do not use Adderall[®] for a condition for which it was not prescribed. Do not give Adderall[®] to other people, even if they have the same condition. It may harm them and it is against the law. This Medication Guide summarizes the most important information about Adderall[®]. If you would like more information, talk with your doctor. You can ask your doctor or pharmacist for information about Adderall[®] that was written for healthcare professionals. 
