


THE PRESIDENT'S INTELLIGENCE CHECKLIST

- a. Despite their absence from the reviewing stands in Red Square yesterday, our attaches managed to get a good look at the equipment as it lined up on a side street. They saw nothing new.
- b. Marshal Malinovsky's speech, otherwise mostly a humdrum set piece, did charge that the US and its allies were stepping up their espionage efforts. This may be part of the stage-setting for the upcoming Penkovsky trial.

2. Yemen


