INGREDIENT NAME: Solriamfetol (SOL ri AM fe tol)

COMMON USES: It is used to help you feel more awake if you are very sleepy during the day from sleep apnea or narcolepsy.

BEFORE USING THIS MEDICINE: WHAT DO I NEED TO TELL MY DOCTOR BEFORE I TAKE THIS DRUG? TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you have an allergy to this drug or any part of this drug. TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you are allergic to any drugs like this one, any other drugs, foods, or other substances. Tell your doctor about the allergy and what signs you had, like rash; hives; itching; shortness of breath; wheezing; cough; swelling of face, lips, tongue, or throat; or any other signs. TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you have high blood pressure. TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you have kidney problems. TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you have taken certain drugs for depression or Parkinson's disease in the last 14 days. This includes isocarboxazid, phenelzine, tranylcypromine, selegiline, or rasagiline. Very high blood pressure may happen. TELL YOUR DOCTOR: If you are taking any of these drugs: Linezolid or methylene blue. This is not a list of all drugs or health problems that interact with this drug. Tell your doctor and pharmacist about all of your drugs (prescription or OTC, natural products, vitamins) and health problems. You must check to make sure that it is safe for you to take this drug with all of your drugs and health problems. Do not start, stop, or change the dose of any drug without checking with your doctor.

HOW TO USE THIS MEDICINE: HOW IS THIS DRUG REST

HOW TO USE THIS MEDICINE: HOW IS THIS DRUG BEST TAKEN? Use this drug as ordered by your doctor. Read all information given to you. Follow all instructions closely. Take this drug when you wake up. Take with or without food. Do not take this drug within 9 hours before bedtime. It may be harder to go to sleep if you take this drug too late in the day. Tablet may be broken in half. HOW DO I STORE AND/OR THROW OUT THIS DRUG? Store at room temperature. Store in a dry place. Do not store in a bathroom. Keep all drugs in a safe place. Keep all drugs out of the reach of children and pets. Throw away unused or expired drugs. Do not flush down a toilet or pour down a drain unless you are told to do so. Check with your pharmacist if you have questions about the best way to throw out drugs. There may be drug take-back programs in your area. WHAT DO I DO IF I MISS A DOSE? Take a missed dose as soon as you think about it. If it is within 9 hours before bedtime, skip the missed dose and go back to your normal time. Do not take 2 doses at the same time or extra doses. same time or extra doses.

CAUTIONS: Tell all of your health care providers that you take this drug. This includes your doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and dentists. This drug is not a cure for sleep problems and does not replace sleep. Stay under the care of your doctor. Avoid driving and doing other tasks or actions that call for you to be alert until you see how this drug affects you. You may also need to avoid doing these things if you do not feel awake enough after taking this drug. If you still feel sleepy after taking this drug, talk with your doctor. This drug may raise blood pressure and heart rate. High blood pressure can raise the chance of heart attack, stroke, or death from heart disease. If you have high blood pressure or heart disease, talk with your doctor. Check blood pressure and heart rate as the doctor has told you. Talk with CAUTIONS: Tell all of your health care providers that you

the doctor. This drug has a risk of abuse and misuse. Use this drug only as you were told by your doctor. Tell your doctor if you have ever abused or been addicted to any drugs or alcohol. WARNING/CAUTION: Even though it may be rare, some people may have very bad and sometimes deadly side effects when taking a drug. Tell your doctor or get medical help right away if you have any of the following signs or symptoms that may be related to a very bad side effect: Signs of an allergic reaction, like rash; hives; itching; red, swollen, blistered, or peeling skin with or without fever; wheezing; tightness in the chest or throat; trouble breathing, swallowing, or talking; unusual hoarseness; or swelling of the mouth, face, lips, tongue, or throat. Signs of high blood pressure like very bad headache or dizziness, passing out, or change in eyesight. A fast heartbeat. Mental, mood, or behavior changes that are new or worse. Trouble sleeping. WHAT ARE SOME OTHER SIDE EFFECTS OF THIS DRUG? All drugs may cause side effects. However, many people have no side effects or only have minor side effects. Call your doctor or get medical help if any of these side effects or any other side effects bother you or do not go away: Headache. Upset stomach. Not hungry. Diarrhea.
