

Prophets scroll

Christ taking the scroll of prophesy and giving it to the ministers foreshadowed.

Christ took the scroll and declared the year of the Lord.

He took the scroll and then handed it to the ministers and sat down.

Luke 4:16 And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.

17 And there was delivered unto him the book of the prophet Esaias. And when **he had opened the book**, he found the place where it was written,

18 The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,

19 To preach the acceptable year of the Lord.

20 And **he closed the book, and he gave it again to the minister, and sat down.** And the eyes of all them that were in the synagogue were fastened on him.

21 And he began to say unto them, **This day is this scripture fulfilled in your ears.**

This is prophetic foreshadowing of what is to come.

In the past two prophets have seen this scroll for the end times that is given to two prophets.

Ezekiel and Zechariah both saw this scroll in foreshadow.

Zech 5:5 Then I turned, and lifted up mine eyes, and looked, and behold **a flying roll.**

2 And he said unto me, What seest thou? And I answered, **I see a flying roll;** the length thereof is twenty cubits, and the breadth thereof ten cubits.

3 Then said he unto me, This is the curse that goeth forth over the face of the whole earth: for every one that stealeth shall be cut off as **on this side according to it;** and every **one that sweareth shall be cut off as on that side according to it.**

This scroll is written on both sides with judgements and the curses to be delivered to earth.

Ezek 2:8 But thou, son of man, hear what I say unto thee; Be not thou rebellious like that rebellious house: open thy mouth, and eat that I give thee.

9 And when I looked, behold, an hand was sent unto me; and, lo, **a roll of a book** was therein;

10 And he spread it before me; and **it was written within and without:** and there was written therein lamentations, and mourning, and woe.

This scroll has written on both sides the morning lamentations and woes which is the end times.

You see this scroll was seen by these two prophets to foretell of what was to come.

This scroll like the foreshadow of Christ taking the scroll and declaring the prophesy and then handing it to the ministers is seen in Revelation.

Christ opens the scroll which is written on both sides.

Rev 5:5 And I saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne **a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.**

2 And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, **Who is worthy to open the book**, and to loose the seals thereof?

3 And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon.

4 And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon.

5 And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, **the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book**, and to loose the seven seals thereof.

Christ then delivers the Scroll to be prophesied to all nations to the ministers.

Rev 10:8 And the voice which I heard from heaven spake unto me again, and said, **Go and take the little book which is open in the hand of the angel** which standeth upon the sea and upon the earth.

9 And I went unto the angel, and said unto him, **Give me the little book.** And he said unto me, Take it, and eat it up; and it shall make thy belly bitter, but it shall be in thy mouth sweet as honey.

10 And **I took the little book** out of the angel's hand, and ate it up; and it was in my mouth sweet as honey: and as soon as I had eaten it, my belly was bitter.

11 And he said unto me, **Thou must prophesy again** before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings.

This scroll is to be delivered and prophesied by the ministers Christ has handed it to for all the nations as foretold by apostle John.

This is the two prophets foreshadowed in Ezekiel and Zechariah who will declare this scroll.

Rev 11:3 And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and **they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days**, clothed in sackcloth.

This is the foreshadow of Christ opening the scroll and handing it to others found in Luke 4.
