2. Congo developments

a) A nervous Tshombé has now agreed to send representatives to Parliament, provided the UN guarantees their safety;

b) The Adoula government is getting ready to try to expel foreign diplomatic representatives, including Soviets and Chinese Communists, from Stanleyville, where they no longer have the figment of a legal basis;

c) Gizenga is apparently still receiving military supplies from the UAR.

4. Cuban currency reform

The move will strengthen the regime's financial position in the short run, and, by giving it control of savings, will also provide an effective new political lever. The Cubans who will be hardest hit are already pretty thoroughly disaffected, but some opposition may be aroused among certain groups of urban workers whose modest savings are threatened.
