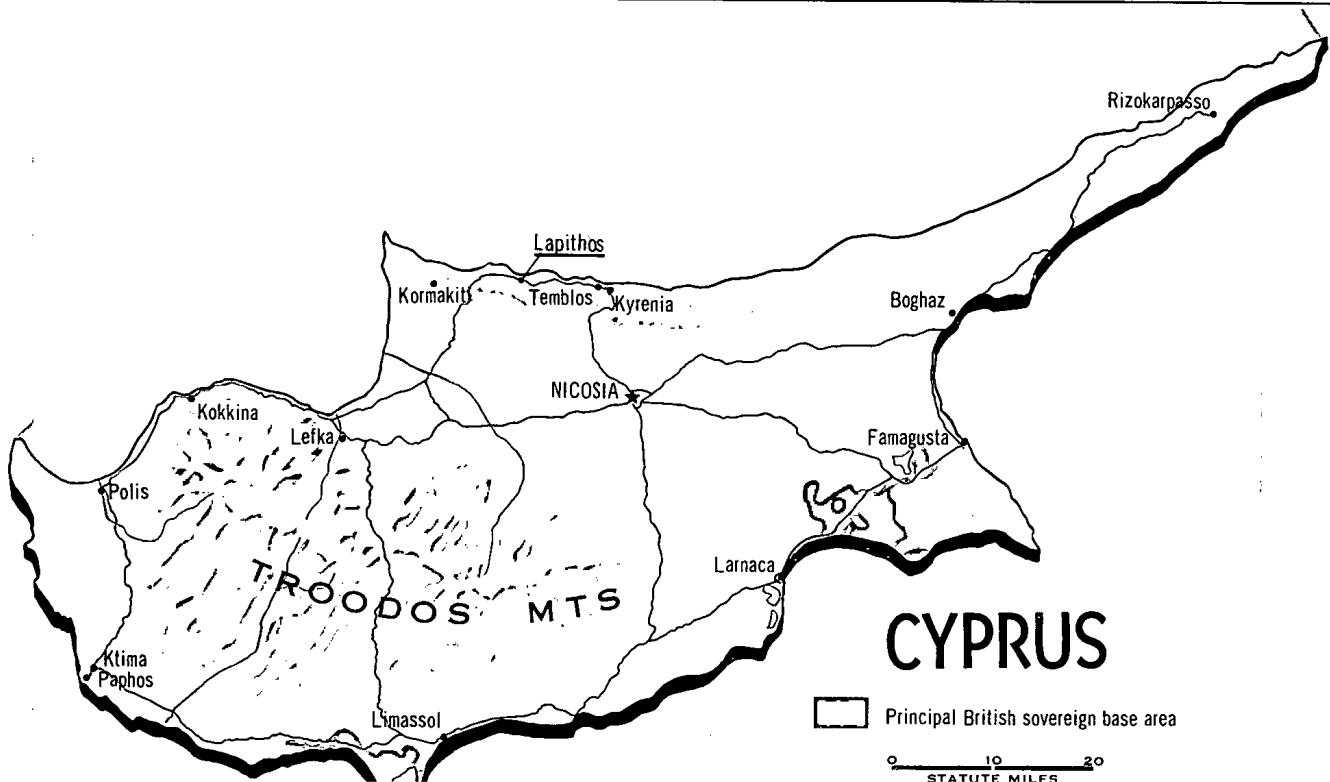
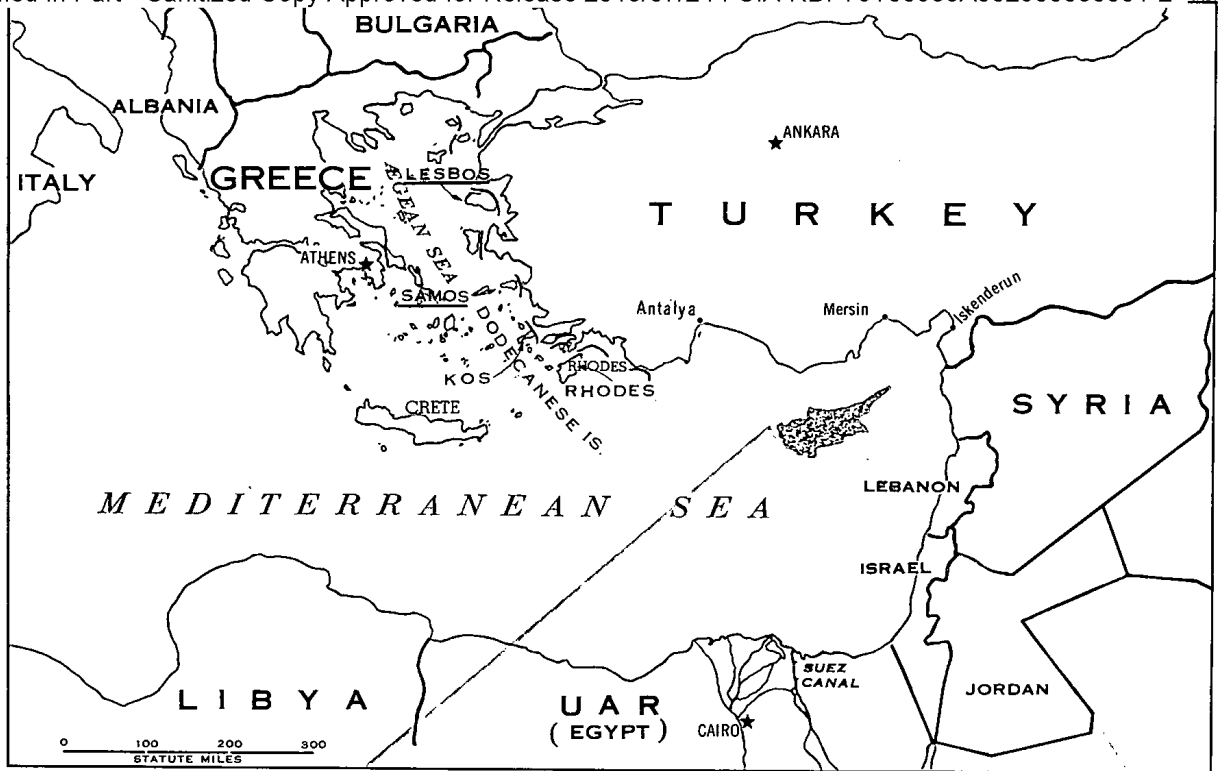

1. Cyprus

a. More arms and ammunition

2. USSR-Japan

a. Moscow has contracted for the purchase of two Japanese chemical plants worth \$52 million. Terms of the sale call for 15-20 percent down and the balance over seven to eight years.

a. Tshombé is undertaking to deal personally with the dissidence in eastern Congo.

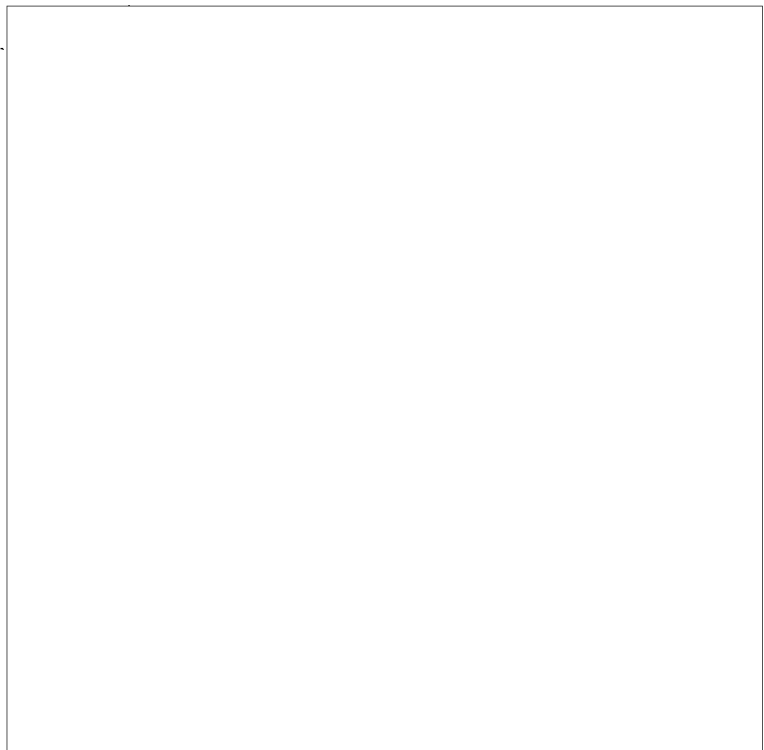
b. He is flying to Bukavu today

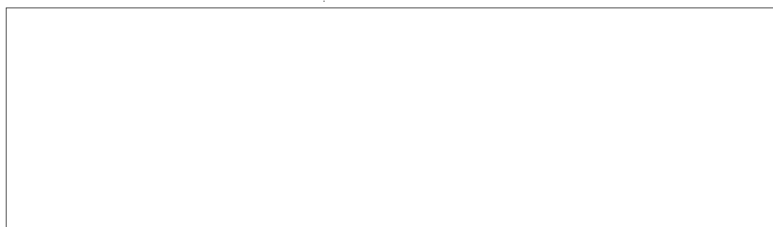

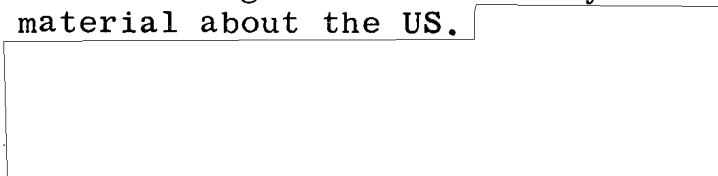

a. The timing of the staged incident at Guantanamo involving the alleged shooting of a Cuban sentry suggests it may have been aimed at the OAS foreign ministers' meeting which opens today.

b. Havana's propagandists were in high gear in near record time turning out inflammatory material about the US.
