



- c. Rebel leaders appear to be gathering in Stanleyville. Gaston Soumialot, eastern CNL head, arrived during the weekend, and CNL leader Christophe Gbenye, who has disappeared from Bujumbura (in Burundi), is presumed en route.
- d. We would not be surprised by some announcement of a dissident government claiming legal status, timed for the 5 September OAU session.

e. Tshombé's request to delay the OAU session until 17 September, primarily and optimistically to provide time for more military victories, appears to be getting nowhere and to have served only to irritate moderate African leaders.
