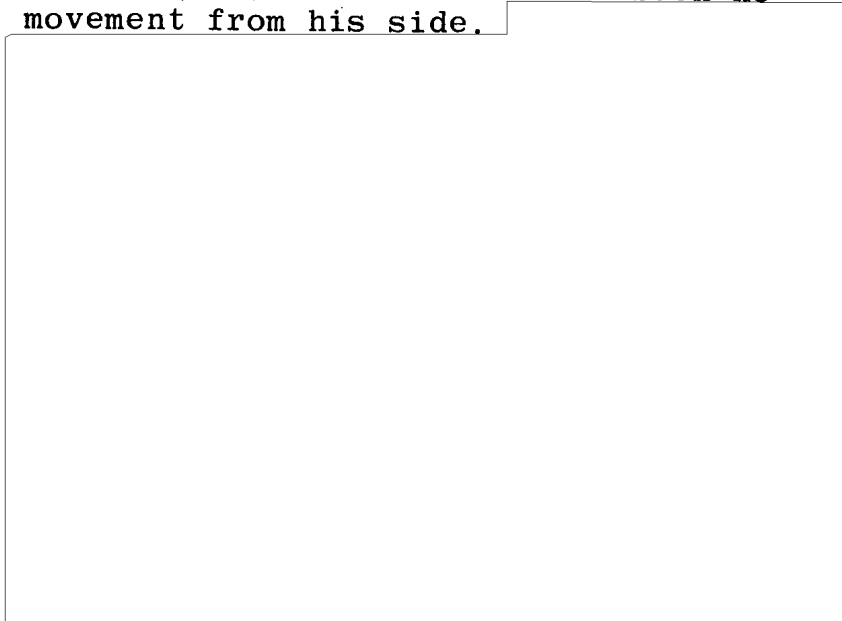

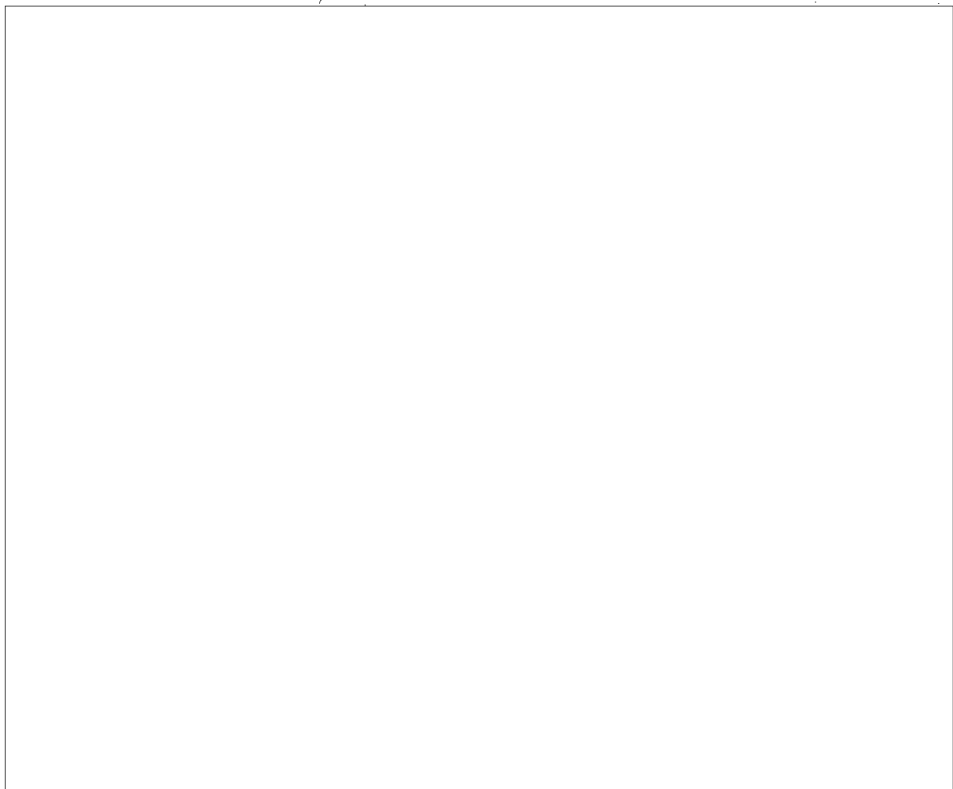
1. North Vietnam

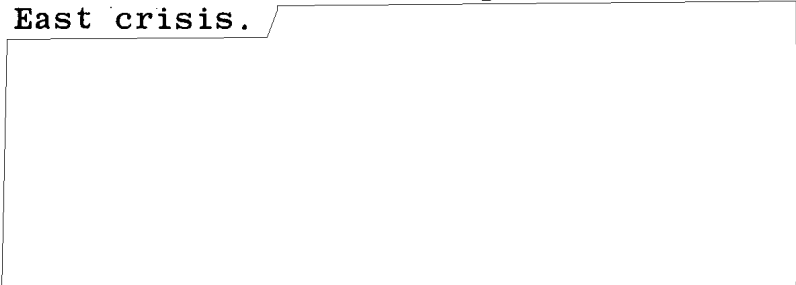

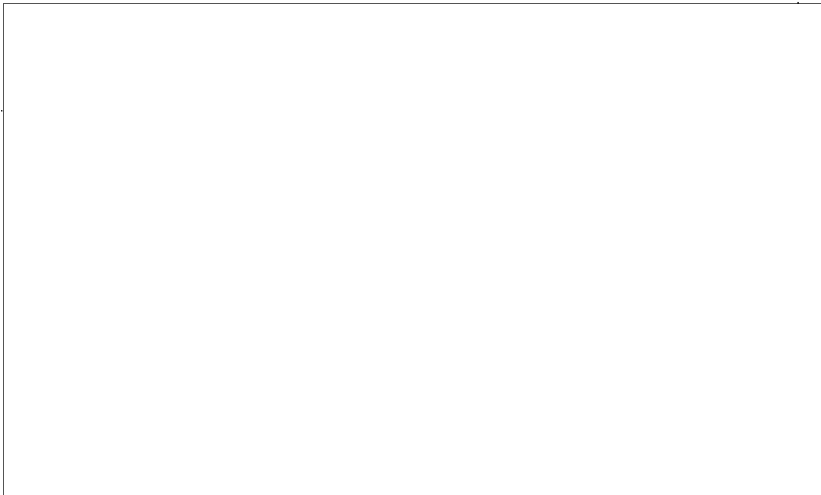
3. Soviet Union

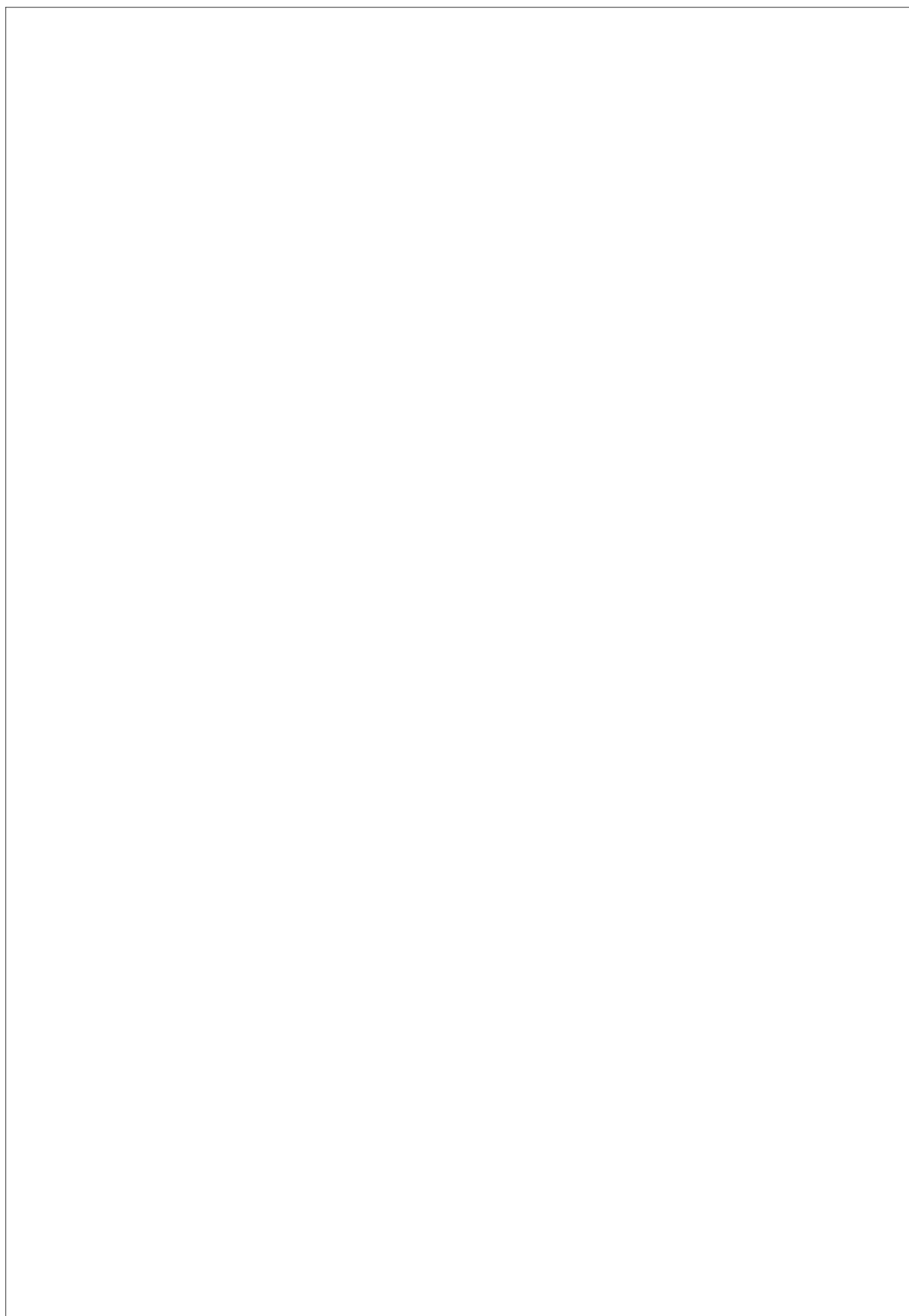

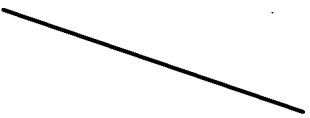
