NOTES

- A. Sino-Soviet Dispute Pravda has published an Indian Communist proposal for a world Communist conference next December. This sounds like an endorsement but we doubt it; the Russians still set up pre-conditions unacceptable to the Chinese. The 13th Anniversary celebrations of the Sino-Soviet alliance were half-hearted in both Moscow and Peiping.
- B. UK According to the British Gallup Poll published Tuesday 60 percent of the respondents favor an early general election, the Labor Party lead over the Conservatives has gone up to 15.5 percentage points, and either Brown or Wilson (elected party leader yesterday) could defeat Macmillan.
- C. Congo Adoula and General Mobutu are increasingly determined to get more Congolese Army troops into Katanga in order to get a firm grip on the province before UN withdrawals begin.
- D. Laos Phoumi says his forces are in touch with Kong Le's and ready to render assistance should the Pathet Lao attack. Phoumi also says he is arranging some funds for Kong Le's troops.
