

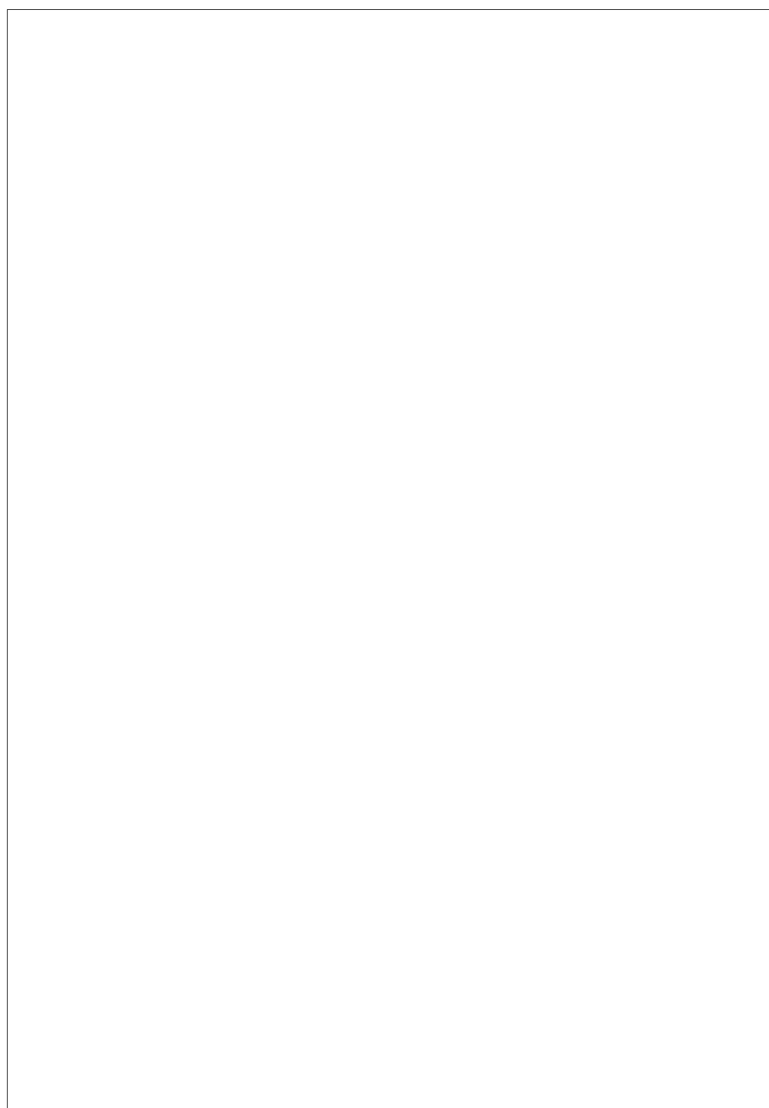

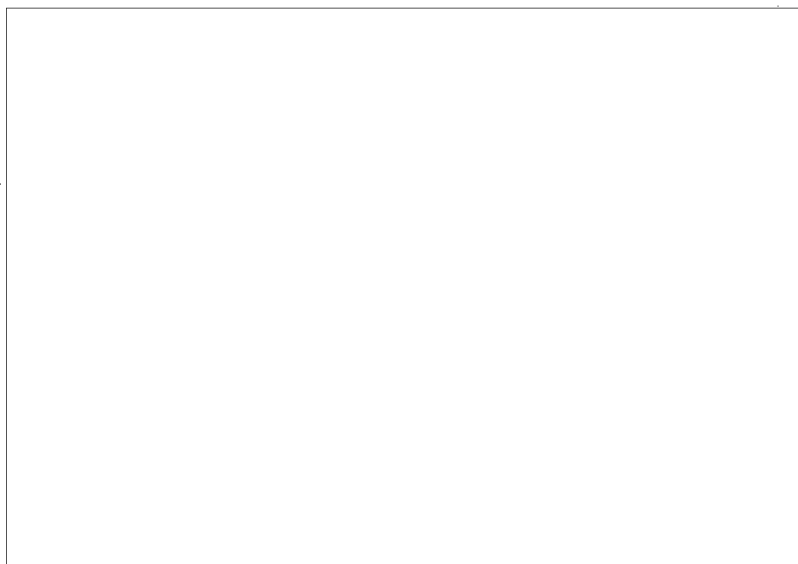

2. Greece

a. Political maneuvering in the wake of Karamanlis' resignation threatens to end in the breakdown of the leading non-Communist parties.

b. The King is trying to lure elements of both parties into a transitional cabinet with authority to revise the controversial election law before new elections are held.

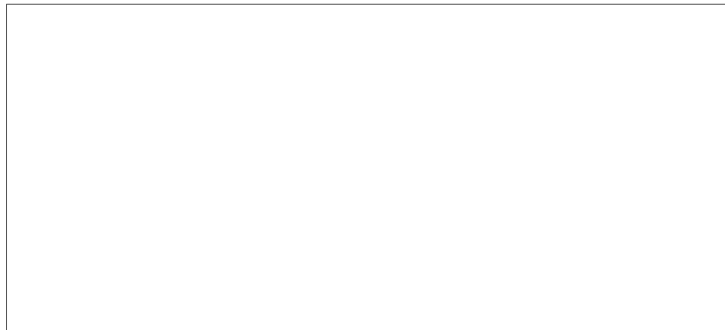
c. The leaders of the two largest parties oppose the King's solution, but may not be able to hold their followers in line.

d. Should the King succeed, the two parties would fragment and a period of intense political jockeying for personal power would follow.

3. Brazil

a. Goulart is letting it be known in various ways that he intends to get rid of his anti-Communist war minister, General Kruel.

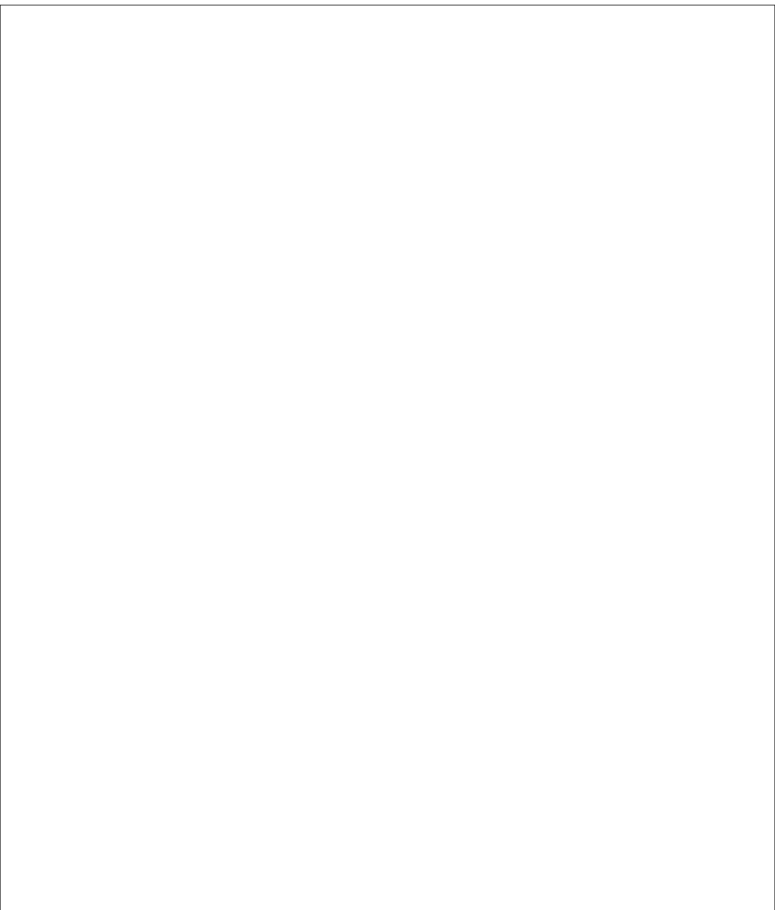

B. South Vietnam No real progress was made at today's meeting between the government commission and Buddhist leaders, although the Buddhists say they detected some sign of give in the government position. The meeting was concerned mostly with procedural matters, however. It is not even clear that the Buddhists have been able to arrange the meeting between their leader Khiet and Diem which they are seeking.

C. USSR-Iraq Moscow has now agreed to substitute conventional air and ground force items for the SAM project suspended by the new Iraqi government. Moscow had earlier declined to make the switch

D. Common Market French officials see continued German opposition to further integration of agriculture as a greater problem for EEC than the question of Britain's relationship to the community ever was. They anticipate another "community crisis" unless De Gaulle can work it out with Adenauer when they meet early next month.

E. Laos Communist forces have surrounded the Phoumi garrison at Attopeu, an isolated town in southeastern Laos near the South Vietnam border. Elimination of this garrison would add to the security of Communist supply and infiltration routes to the Viet Cong. Phoumi calls the situation "very grave" and has called for an ICC investigation.

F. West Europe British, German, and Scandinavian socialist party and labor leaders plan to meet in Stockholm next month. Their purpose [redacted] will be to [redacted] get the European unity movement back on the tracks. Senator Humphrey and Walter Reuther have been invited.
