- D. INDONESIA-MALAYSIA: SUKARNO HAS STARTED THE NEW YEAR BY ORDERING AN INTENSIFICATION OF THE INDONESIAN EFFORT TO DESTROY MALAYSIA. WE ARE NOT SURE WHAT ADDITIONAL MEASURES HE HAS IN MIND, BUT HE HAS TALKED ABOUT STEPPING UP BORDER PATROLS AND PERHAPS PAYING A PERSONAL VISIT TO INDONESIAN BORNEO.
- E. THAILAND-CAMBODIA: THE THAIS, WHO ARE VIOLENTLY OPPOSED TO SIHANOUK'S 14-NATION CONFERENCE TO GUARANTEE CAMBODIAN NEUTRALITY, ARE TOYING WITH THE IDEA OF COUNTERING BY CALLING FOR A PURELY SOUTHEAST ASIAN CONFERENCE WITHOUT CHINESE OR US ATTENDANCE. WE DOUBT THAT SIHANOUK WOULD ACCEPT.
- F. ALGERIA-TANGANYIKA: A CONSIGNMENT OF ALGERIAN ARMS HAS ARRIVED IN DAR-ES-SALAAM. THE ARMS, WHICH BEN BELLA PROMISED PRESIDENT NYERERE LAST JULY, ARE LARGELY FOR THE TANGANYIKAN ARMY BUT SOME MAY END UP IN THE HANDS OF REFUGEES FROM MOZAMBIQUE AND SOUTH AFRICA WHO ARE NOW BASED IN TANGANYIKA.
